

Village of Clinton
Regular Council Meeting Minutes
of
Tuesday, July 16, 2019

Mayor Knack called the meeting to order on Tuesday, July 16, 2019, at 7:00 p.m. in the Clinton Village Hall. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by DeAnna Passmore and recited by all those present.

Roll Call: Council Members Present: Mr. Goch, Mrs. Allega, Mrs. Godwin, Mrs. Conroy, Mr. McDaniel and Mrs. Gensimore.

Others Present: Representative from the Summit County Health Department; Lewis Rash, and DeAnna Passmore, residents; Terry Siegenthaler, Street Supt., and Mayor Al Knack.

Summit County Public Health Presentation. There was a discussion on mosquito control and that more information can be found on their website including a spray schedule. Floodwater brings out nuisance mosquitos that are out during the day but do not carry the West Nile virus. Once things dry up, those mosquitos will go away. Only a few West Nile virus issues have been reported so far.

They test water for a small fee. The Village will receive information on this.

There are dental services provided in Akron as well based on income. You can obtain a birth or death certificate from their office. Can be done online. You can also receive immunization.

Project DAWN is a Narcan kit with training provided for free. Mayor Knack invited the County to our Applefest to share this information.

The County will also come and take tires that are laying around as if left to lay around are a breeding ground for mosquitos. Mr. Siegenthaler asked if there was a limit of how many tires they would pick up and the response was that there was no limit. It was talked about possibly having a cleanup day in Clinton for unused tires. Residents only.

Approval of Council Minutes: Mr. McDaniel motioned to accept the July 2, 2019 minutes, second by Mrs. Godwin. Corrections to Mr. Rader's last name will be made.

Roll Call: Allega, Godwin, Conroy, Goch voted Aye, McDaniel and Gensimore abstained. Motion passes.

Solicitor's Report: No report.

Police Report: No report.

Fire Chief's Report: Was in the packet.

Street Commissioner Report:

Salt came in at \$79 / ton. We got ahold of PUCO about the low hanging wires and everyone is working on getting this remedied. If in two days we don't see action, we need to call back. We need a Streets Committee Meeting. Taylor road has been babied for many years and cones are up there as a result of the heavy rains but a permanent fix is of utmost importance. It's a safety hazard. He feels the money put aside for a part time person can be used. There is an alarm going off at the Limbach building and the owners will get ahold of someone to permanently turn off as it is not in service. He brought up the alarm /siren and

why it can't be set off manually. Like if there is a train wreck. He advised of Northwest schools having designated places to pick up the kids in an emergency as parents could be at work. The town needs educated and we need an updated emergency manual – evacuation plan. Discussion continued on past practices and the plan we have in place will be updated with new /current information.

Mr. McDaniel said that Taylor Road has sides caving in, if we did nothing that nice road would get bad fast. Mr. Siegenthaler is concerned of a liability law suit and the road needs closed. He wanted to get this on the record. The fence issue at the park is still there and Council agreed to pay to turn the electric on there IF the fence gets fixed and it's not been addressed. Again, this issue is on the record. Mr. McDaniel stated we were going to do the inspection of the fence. Mr. Pitchford advised to take the fence down. A Streets Committee meeting needs to be scheduled.

A meeting will be held Friday, July 19 at 6 PM.

Unfinished Business:

Mayor's Communications:

He went to meeting on July 10 in which Governor DeWine was present with many other local mayors regarding the flooding issue. Representatives from many area agencies were also present. They are trying to hammer out a budget on this issue. The Governor wants to form a task force hopefully by the end of the month and Mr. Bill Judge, Mayor of Barberton will put this together. Mayor Knack provided information at this meeting submitted by Clinton property owners affected by this flood and suggested Fred Bean from Luna Lake be a member of this task force. ODNR reported they have protocol regarding streams and rivers that states if there is an obstruction on your property that backs up the water flow, the property owner is responsible for it. Army Corp, Muskingham Watershed as well have their rules on their specific areas of oversight.

Melway Paving will be doing the paving work when they are done working in another county. It will be about three weeks before they get to Summit County - maybe the beginning of August. We will do paving in Warwick – South First and South Fifth - \$60,000. We will be getting a price from Melway.

Council Communications:

Mrs. Allega spoke on MuniCode which is a new online alternative to Walter Drane – American Legal. Pricing looks better. There are two options – they do everything, or we do a good portion of the work. We may need to give Sue Mayberry an extra half hour or hour per week to do it. Mrs. Allega said she is still working with Leah on this regarding price. Mr. McDaniel said that with Walter Drane, there was a lot of things we could not do, with American Legal, everything was searchable. But it does not sound likely that if Sue will be able to upload and it will fill in all the blanks and do the searches. Mrs. Allega stated this will be looked into further. They are moving into the Ohio market.

Mrs. Allega made a motion to pay the insurance premium of \$8,678, second by Mr. McDaniel. The insurance company evaluated buildings and the premium this year came down. The fiscal officer requested this motion be made.

Roll Call: Allega, Godwin, Conroy, Goch, McDaniel and Gensimore all voted Aye. Motion passes.

Citizens' Comments:

Mr. Rash said that in the 2-1/2 years he has lived here, all he hears is we are going to do certain things, and then we don't do it. If you say you are going to do it, just do it. He asked if his street is going to be fixed this year? Talking about Division Street. Mayor Knack said he will meet the guy in three weeks.

Mayor Knack stated that Clinton Aluminum bought land in Norton and may be moving.

Deanna Passmore asked the status of the street light that was covered up by trees. Mayor Knack reported that Metro Parks owns and maintains those lights and told Terry Siegenthaler the person responsible will address when he returns from vacation.

No third readings.

Second Reading

Resolution No. R-19-20

A Resolution Authorizing the Approval and Adoption of the Summit County Hazard Mitigation Plan for the Executive's Department of Law, Insurance and Risk Management – Division of Public Safety Management Agency, and Declaring an Emergency.

Mrs. Allega made a motion to suspend the three-reading rule, second by Mr. McDaniel. Roll Call: Allega, Godwin, Conroy, Goch, McDaniel and Gensimore all voted Aye. Motion passes.

Mrs. Allega made a motion to pass Resolution No. R-10-20, second by Mrs. Gensimore. Roll Call: Allega, Godwin, Conroy, Goch, McDaniel and Gensimore all voted Aye. Motion passes.

Mrs. Gensimore asked the status on the tabled legislation regarding the park rental fee. Mr. Goch stated that he was going to talk to Solicitor Pitchford Friday.

New Business: Nothing to report.

General Discussion: Mrs. Gensimore asked Terry Siegenthaler what time he wanted to take the fence down tomorrow. He said that he would take it down when someone directed him to. Mr. Goch said the last time he was down there the fence was padded. Mr. Siegenthaler said it was never padded.

Mr. Siegenthaler said we need to set up a date for the tire drop off and put that in the newsletter. Village residents only.

Mrs. Gensimore asked again about the fence. Mr. Siegenthaler said it's up to council. I made you aware three months ago. Mr. McDaniel thought Mr. Goch was going to contact the baseball people about this. Mr. Siegenthaler thought we were not going to turn the electric on until this was fixed. The Village is paying for the inspection, then the baseball league will have it turned on. More discussion continued on this issue.

Mr. Siegenthaler said he was closing Taylor road and putting up detours. This topic will be resolved Friday, at 6 PM.

Mrs. Gensimore made a motion to authorize the street superintendent to close Taylor Road tomorrow if he feels that it should be done, second by Mrs. Allega.

Mrs. Allega said if Mr. Siegenthaler, in his professional opinion, says we need to close Taylor Road, that's good enough for me. There are people who need to be notified of this closure. Mr. Siegenthaler said Chippewa already knows and agrees this needs done.

Roll Call: Allega, Godwin, Conroy, Goch, McDaniel and Gensimore all voted Aye. Motion passes.

Regarding the fence, Mr. Siegenthaler feels we should give them the option to fix it or the Village will take it down. This will be discussed at Friday's meeting.


Applefest was discussed relative to preparations for this event, and Mrs. Gensimore asked for council's help to volunteer with this.
